To the Honorable Members of the 2017 Oklahoma Legislature:

The Oklahoma Constitution establishes the Judiciary as a separate and independent Branch of State Government. The Constitution charges the Judiciary with the duty to ensure the courts are open to every person, and that justice is administered without sale, denial, delay or prejudice. The Judiciary exists to help the citizens of Oklahoma resolve disputes peacefully and to obtain justice uniformly throughout the State in a fair and impartial manner, according to the rule of law.

The Supreme Court, by and through the Administrative Office of the Courts, maintains records concerning the caseloads in each district court judicial district. These records assist the Supreme Court and the state trial judges of the respective districts to equalize the workload of the various judges and address any conflicts in a judicial officer's completion of their job.

Each year, the Supreme Court submits a report to the Legislature as provided in 20 O.S. 2011, §16.11. This report contains (1) caseload information from each of Oklahoma's 26 judicial districts (2) any recommendations regarding judicial district boundaries and the number of district and associate district judges, and (3) the formula for determining the number of special judges. The information in the current annual report reflects the Judiciary's diligent work in adjudicating the thousands of cases filed statewide this past year.

Based on the caseload analysis, the Supreme Court does not recommend a change in the judicial district boundaries, the number of district and associate district judges statewide or the formula for determining the number of special judges. The caseload analysis does support, however, a recommendation to move one of the two district judge positions in Okmulgee County (Judicial District 24) to Canadian County (Judicial District 26). 20 O.S. §92.25. The position in question is currently vacant due to the retirement of Judge Michael Claver. The Governor

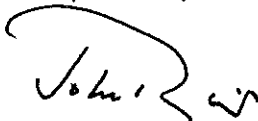
and Judicial Nominating Commission have deferred filling this vacancy until the Legislature can consider this move. If approved, this move would create a second District Judge position in Canadian County (Judicial District 26), to be nominated and elected at large. 20 O.S. §92.27

The efficient operation of the judicial branch of government would not be possible without the willingness of Oklahoma trial judges to accept temporary assignment in counties other than their resident counties. These temporary assignments occur to expedite the trial of particular cases, to help manage extraordinary increases in caseloads and when all local judges are disqualified. In addition to these sacrifices, the trial judges have endured prolonged vacancies in their judicial staff positions in an effort to help meet budgetary constraints.

While the Oklahoma Judiciary can be proud of the fair and efficient manner in which cases are managed and decided, achieving this goal would not be possible without the invaluable assistance of the Court Clerks and their staffs in each of our seventy-seven counties. Their continued good work and adequate funding are essential to the functioning and success of the Judiciary in meeting our obligation to the citizens of Oklahoma.

I can confidently state that all the judges and judicial branch personnel of this state serve with a single mission - Justice For All.

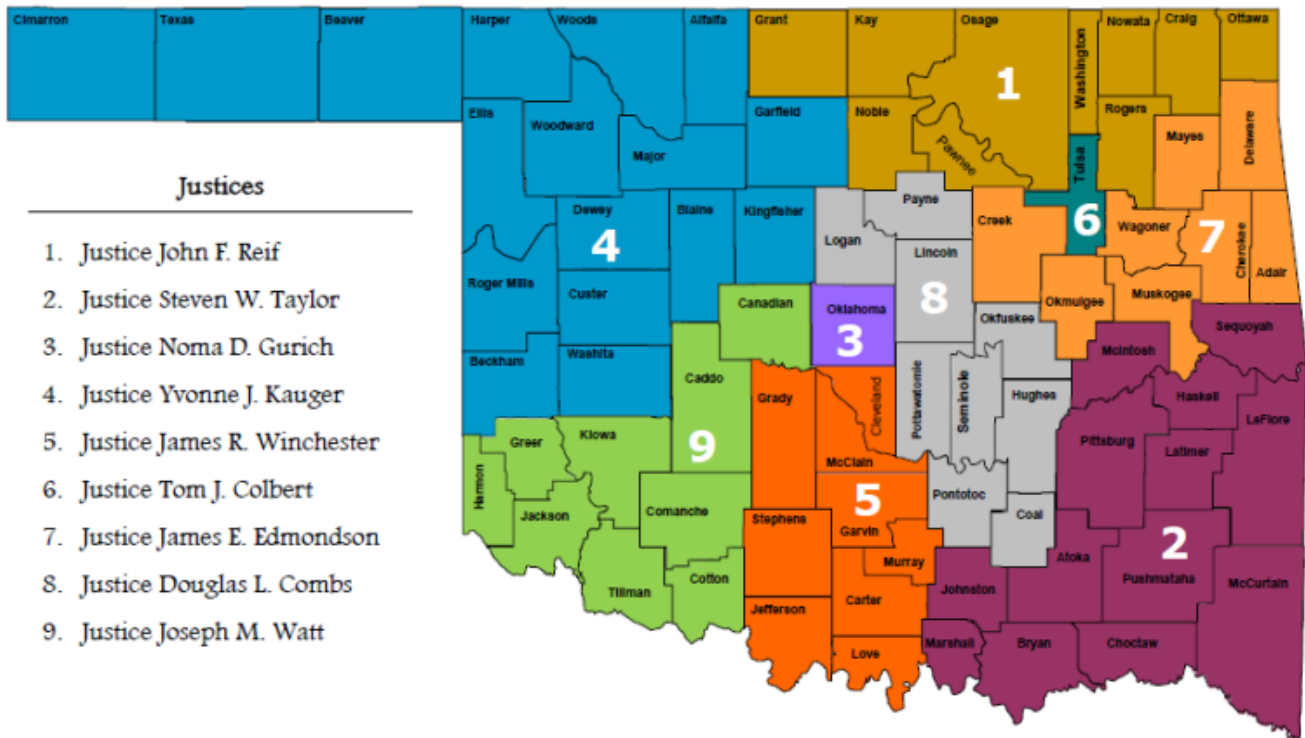

District Court Statistical Reporting

1. **Civil:** all civil case filings for cases valued at \$10,000 or more (CJ) and cases up to \$10,000 (CS). Cases are disposed by the filing of a Dismissal, Journal Entry, a Court Order or a Court Minute entering judgment. A case disposition is counted only once unless a case was dismissed and later reopened.
2. **Small Claims:** all actions for the recovery money or property where the value does not exceed \$7,500. Cases are disposed by the filing of a Dismissal, Journal Entry, a Court Order or a Court Minute entering judgment.
3. **Divorce:** all proceedings for divorce initiated. Cases are disposed by the filing of a Dismissal or Decree, Journal Entry, a Court Order or a Court Minute entering judgment.
4. **Victim Protective Orders:** all victim Protective Orders issued by the Court. Only original proceedings from which an Order was issued are counted.
5. **Family/Domestic All Other:** all incoming reciprocal cases (cases sent from other states to Oklahoma for enforcement), income assignment, separate maintenance and paternity actions. Cases are disposed by the filing for a Dismissal, Journal Entry, a Court Order or a Court Minute entering judgment.
6. **Adoptions:** all proceedings for adoption initiated. Cases are disposed by the filing of a Journal Entry, a Court Order or a Court Minute entering judgment.
7. **Probate:** all probates, estates, distributions, trusts and actions for protective services to the elderly. For the purposes of this report, a probate case is considered disposed when a personal representative is appointed.
8. **Mental Health:** all proceedings initiated for inpatient commitment to a mental health facility. For the purposes of this report, a mental health case is considered disposed when a jury verdict or Court Order of Commitment is issued, or when a jury fails to find or the Court does not issue an Order of Commitment.
9. **Guardianship:** all proceedings initiated for adult and child guardianships and conservatorships. Disposition is by the filing of a Journal Entry, a Court Order or Court Minute entering judgment.
10. **Marriage Licenses:** all marriage licenses issued.

- 11. Licenses All Other:** all beverage, closing out sale, pool hall, private process server and transient merchant licenses. A renewal license is counted as a new license.
- 12. Felony:** all case filings for Murder I, DUI and all other felony cases. A separate case is counted for each Defendant, even if multiple Defendants are listed on the Information. Applications to Revoke Suspended Sentences are counted as a new case filing. Cases are considered disposed by dismissal, plea of guilty, a jury or non-jury verdict. Dismissals of counts are not included unless they totally dismiss a defendant from the proceeding. Active deferred cases are included in the pending cases.
- 13. Misdemeanor:** all case filings for DUI, wildlife, criminal property and all other misdemeanor cases. A separate case is counted for each Defendant, even if multiple Defendants are listed on the information. Applications to Revoke Suspended Sentences are counted as a new case filing. Cases are considered disposed by dismissal, plea of guilty, a jury or non-jury verdict. Dismissals of counts are not included unless they totally dismiss a defendant from the proceeding. Active deferred cases are included in the pending cases.
- 14. Traffic:** tickets for all traffic violations. Cases are disposed by dismissal, plea of guilty, jury or non-jury verdict. Active deferred cases are included in the pending cases.
- 15. Juvenile:** all case filings for child in need of supervision, child in need of treatment, delinquency, deprived, inpatient mental health and all other juvenile cases. Only original Petitions are counted. Cases are considered disposed by adjudication, jury or non-jury verdict, stipulation, when the judge entered an Order closing the case, or when the juvenile reaches the age of majority.
